Time to clean out your garages, closets, sheds and add to your holiday fund! Please participate—If you have a special site to advertise the sale, please help by posting the date and times.



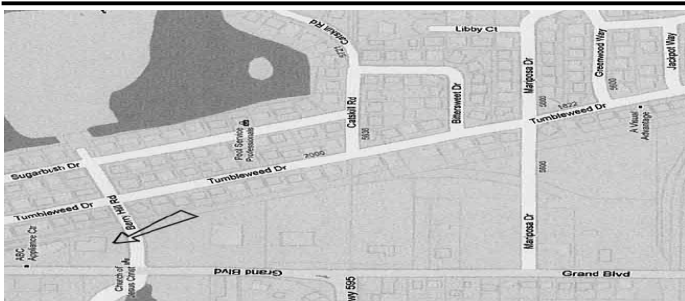

Help Light up the Neighborhood

Now that we are on standard time, it is more important than even to turn on your outside garage lights (not entrance lights) from dusk till dawn to light up our neighborhood. More people will be out and about on our sidewalks and streets after dark, and we can all help to provide more light for our sidewalks and streets.

DEED RESTRICTIONS-Things to Remember

Parking on the street is prohibited. This is posted at the beginning of our subdivision and is for your safety. Emergency vehicles must be able to get down our streets. If there are also service people or delivery vehicles temporarily parked, the street can be impassable.

Pasco County Noise Ordinance mandates “Quiet Time” - 10pm to 7am everyday.

This includes loud car radio and engine noises—deliberately revving your engine as you enter or leave. Please be more considerate of your neighbors and their ear-drums!

Dogs must be on a leash when not behind a fence. Dogs cannot be loose in the Sub-division. This is Pasco County ordinance too. Even though your pet may appear harm-

less to you, others can be scared or hurt—especially children and the elderly. Even playing, a child or elderly person can be knocked down as well as scared by your pet. Be a good “pack leader” for your pet, and keep him safe behind a fence or

When you walk your dog/dogs, be sure to pick up their waste. It is the responsible thing to do as a pet owner and neighbor. Also, leaving waste on the ground, street, or walk, adds to the pollution of our water.

RECYCLING:

Paper can now be recycled with plastic, aluminum cans, and clear, green, or brown glass using your designated container.

To recycle all the used batteries take them to our local library on Mile Stretch.

Paper—Newspaper, Boxes, broken down flat, Envelopes, Any clean paper may also be taken to: Pasco Schools have recycle bins that earn revenue for the schools. (Nearest to FHE—Sunray Elementary next to Publix on Sunray or South Holiday Library on Mile Stretch. Also the Public Library.

If you are unable to take your papers to a Recycle bin, call Millie Olsen 727-943-0939 or 727-389-0033 (leave message) and pick up will be arranged. You can also leave your paper to be recycled on Millie's front porch at 5629 Ivy Lane in FHE or bring it to the meeting.

RECIPES

With many of our favorite holidays just around the corner, please remember those less fortunate as your church and many other organizations help provide meals. You can help in many ways—food donations, cash donations, and giving your time.

COOKING

This is the time of year I pass on my secret to a perfect pecan pie. Always **add 1 additional egg** to the recipe to make your filling firm. Remember when Karo syrup printed their recipe, large eggs were much larger. After many years of less than perfect pecan pies, this tip assures me of a perfect filling.

This is a recipe for an alternate pecan dessert from my cousin Glenna—best traditional Chef in our family. This is good to make the day before as it needs to be chilled.

Pecan Pie

1 cup sugar
1/2 tsp. Baking Powder
1 teaspoon Vanilla
14 crushed Ritz crackers
1 cup of chopped pecans
3 egg whites beaten stiff

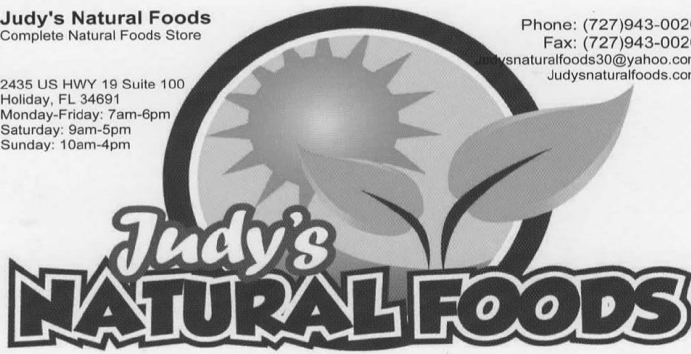
Mix together and then fold in egg whites. Grease a 9" pie pan (I use butter). Pour Into pan and bake at 325 degrees for 30 Minutes.

Add cool whip topping after pie is cool and Refrigerate 4-6 hours (or more) before serving.

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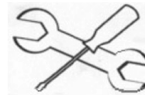
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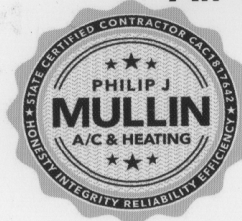
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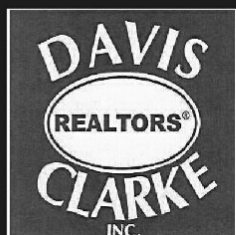
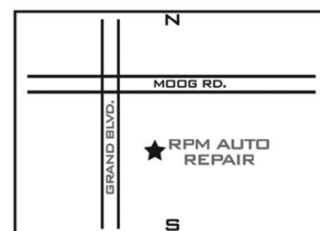
