



LIGHTING THE NEIGHBORHOOD Many thanks to everyone who is lighting up our neighborhood!!

Continue to help light up our neighborhood by keeping your outside garage (not porch) lights turned on from dusk until dawn. If you are not doing this now, please join us. It is amazing how much more this "lights up our streets", making a safer environment for all. If you notice a really dark area on your street ask your neighbor to join in lighting up the area or contact me. I have noticed more and more garage lights on in area Neighborhoods.

Continue to lock the vehicles in your driveway, even though no more burglaries have been reported. It's just a good habit.

You can report problems by calling the Sheriff's office at **800-706-2488** anonymously. If you have reported suspicious activity before, do it again. If reporting stops, it will be assumed the problem has been solved. I was told by a Local Sheriff's deputy this is important and may be the reason some of our biggest concerns have not been eliminated.

Call **727-847-8102** for non-emergency issues and remember these are answered on a priority basis.

DEED RESTRICTIONS

Reminder: The front of your home cannot be used for storage—behind your fence or in your garage is the right place.

Trailers must be parked behind your fence so they cannot be seen. This is a Pasco County ordinance as well as a Deed Restriction.

Reminder: Dogs must be on a leash when not behind a fence. Be a good "pack leader" for your pets, and keep them safe behind a fence or leashed.

Reminder: Not everyone wants to hear the bass in your car inside their houses. Please abide by the Pasco County noise

Ordinance as you drive through the Subdivision.


